Dear Mr. President:

Under the provisions of 42 U.S.C. Section 401, §§5121-5206 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, and implemented by 44 CFR § 206.36, I humbly request an expedited major disaster declaration for the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) as a result of severe high winds in excess of 110 mph, heavy rainfall and flooding, excessive storm surges and high surf in low lying areas due to Typhoon Soudelor (13W). Typhoon Soudelor (13W) began on August 1, 2015 and continues to cause suffering in the islands of Saipan and Tinian.

In response to the situation, I have taken appropriate action under Commonwealth law and directed the execution of the Commonwealth Emergency Plan on August 1, 2015, for Rota, Tinian and Saipan, in accordance with Section 401 of the Stafford Act.

We have undergone local efforts to conduct a Rapid Needs Assessment and a Preliminary Damage Assessment to document the aftermath of Typhoon Soudelor (13W). Reports have indicated 484 residents have evacuated to designated shelters due to damages to their homes and/or the lack of power and water. Public shelters were underutilized due to families resorting to neighboring homes as an immediate form of alternative shelter. Severe winds have damaged roofs to homes and water damage has occurred to many residential homes, public facilities and business establishments. There have been reported injuries to residents caused by the storm. Emergency responders are using alternative response vehicles to replace ambulances that were damaged during the storm.

The movement of Typhoon Soudelor (13W) remained on its projected course and thus the public was warned to remain indoors until clear conditions have been issued. The utility corporation has reported downed power lines by the severe wind velocity and flooded power generation plant, which affects the island's water supply and sewage system. Potable water supply to the island will be offline and will remain so until power is restored. There is an urgent need for generators to bring critical infrastructure back on-line throughout the island. The corporation is focused on power restoration to critical public facilities, such as the hospital. Once critical public facilities are restored and the power generation plant is repaired, the utility company will then energize the primary distribution and will continue to work in replacing downed power poles and lines in secondary distributions until full restoration is accomplished. Communications in some areas have been interrupted, while some areas remain intermittent.

Typhoon Soudelor (13W) is the seventh storm that has impacted the Commonwealth between October 2014 and July 2015. State and local resources have been impacted by these storm events compromising the Commonwealth's ability to respond to and recover. Therefore, I have determined that Typhoon Soudelor (13W) has devastated our islands' infrastructure, power, water, roadways and public facilities, and that effective response and recovery is beyond the capabilities of the Commonwealth and the affected local governments and that supplementary Federal Assistance is necessary protect property and save lives.

We estimate the extent of the damages will exceed \$20 million in Saipan and Tinian, an amount beyond the capability of the Commonwealth to provide.

I am specifically requesting the types of assistance as follows:

The following information is furnished on the nature and amount of Commonwealth and local resources that have been or will be used to alleviate the conditions of this disaster:

- All of the emergency measures taken to ensure public safety have exhausted our government's resources in transporting evacuees and personnel to assist in operating temporary shelters.
- Emergency personnel from the Commonwealth's homeland office have been pre-deployed to the Municipality of Tinian to support public safety and medical services. This was necessary

based on prior declared events which prevented emergency personnel to respond immediately after a storm because of unsafe weather conditions.

- Commonwealth Utilities Corporation personnel have been dispatched to begin restoration of power, water and wastewater services throughout the islands, but without the resources of the federal government, it would take years to accomplish this monumental task.

- The Department of Public Works together with the Department of Lands and Natural Resources and the Office of the Mayor's personnel will work extensively on debris clearance and repair of secondary roads to restore public access and to prioritize repair and restoration of damages to critical infrastructure facilities.

- The Mayors of Saipan, Tinian and Rota have initiated response and recovery activities to clear public access and to prevent any epidemics from occurring.

I certify that for this major disaster, the Commonwealth and local governments will assume all applicable non-Federal share of costs required by the Stafford Act.

I request Direct Federal Assistance as well as all categories of Public Assistance (A-G) and Individual Assistance to address our immediate and critical needs to protect the public health and safety and dispose of the debris created by Typhoon Soudelor (13W). The CNMI's unique composition of many inhabited islands presents many challenges in coordinating disaster response operations since it requires the Commonwealth government to incur enormous costs in chartering air travel between islands either by aircraft or helicopter or by marine vessels depending on the weather conditions, and the urgency and most effective means to deliver emergency personnel and supplies following a major disaster. This disaster has overwhelmed our resources. I would like to request that the requirement for Joint PDA's be waived since this incident is of such severity and magnitude that formal field damage assessments are not required to establish the need for supplemental federal assistance under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (The Stafford Act).

In accordance with 44 CFR 206.208, the Government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands agrees that it will with respect to direct Federal Assistance:


1. Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements and rights-of-ways necessary to accomplish the approved work;
2. Hold and save the United States free from damages due to the requested work, and shall indemnify the Federal Government against any claims arising from such work;
3. Provide reimbursement to FEMA for the non-federal share of the cost of such work in accordance with the provisions of the FEMA-CNMI agreement; and
4. Assist and support all Federal Agencies on local jurisdictional matters.

In addition, I anticipate the need for debris removal, which poses an immediate threat to lives, public health, and safety for the islands of Saipan, Tinian and Rota that are affected. Pursuant to Sections 403 and 407 of the Stafford Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 5170b and 5173, the Commonwealth agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the United States of America for any claims arising from the removal of debris or wreckage for this disaster.

The Commonwealth agrees that debris removal from public and private property will not occur until the landowner signs an unconditional authorization for the removal of debris.

I have designated Mr. Marvin K. Seman as the State Coordinating Officer (SCO) and Ms. Virginia Villagomez, as the Governor's Authorized Representative (GAR) for this event. These individuals will work with the Federal Emergency Management Agency in properly documenting the damages and may provide further information or justification on my behalf.

Utilities-extensive damage to our power generation. The entire Island is without power, impacting water distribution, waste water processing systems and hundreds of downed power poles, lines and transformers. The power generation plant is expected to be off-line for more than a month.

Hospital-the sole hospital is impacted by the lack of power and is dependent on generator power and potable water delivery,

Roads-primary & secondary roads are affected by major debris and downed power poles throughout the island of Saipan; public facilities have sustained extensive damage from wind and water inundation.


