

## Rota Special Resource Study

The National Park Service will soon be conducting a “special resource study” of sites on the island of Rota in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

This study will determine whether a national park site could be appropriate on the island.

The study will evaluate the significance of the natural and cultural resources, the feasibility of different management options, whether management is an appropriate role for the NPS. The study will also consider what the environmental, social and economic impacts of a park might be.

CNMI’s Congressional Representative Sablan advocated for this study. The US Congress directed that this study be completed.

The study will start in 2016.

Your thoughts and ideas are important to the study. We will want to know what you think about the special resources of the island, what you hope for the future of those places, and what you think about the idea of a national park on Rota.
